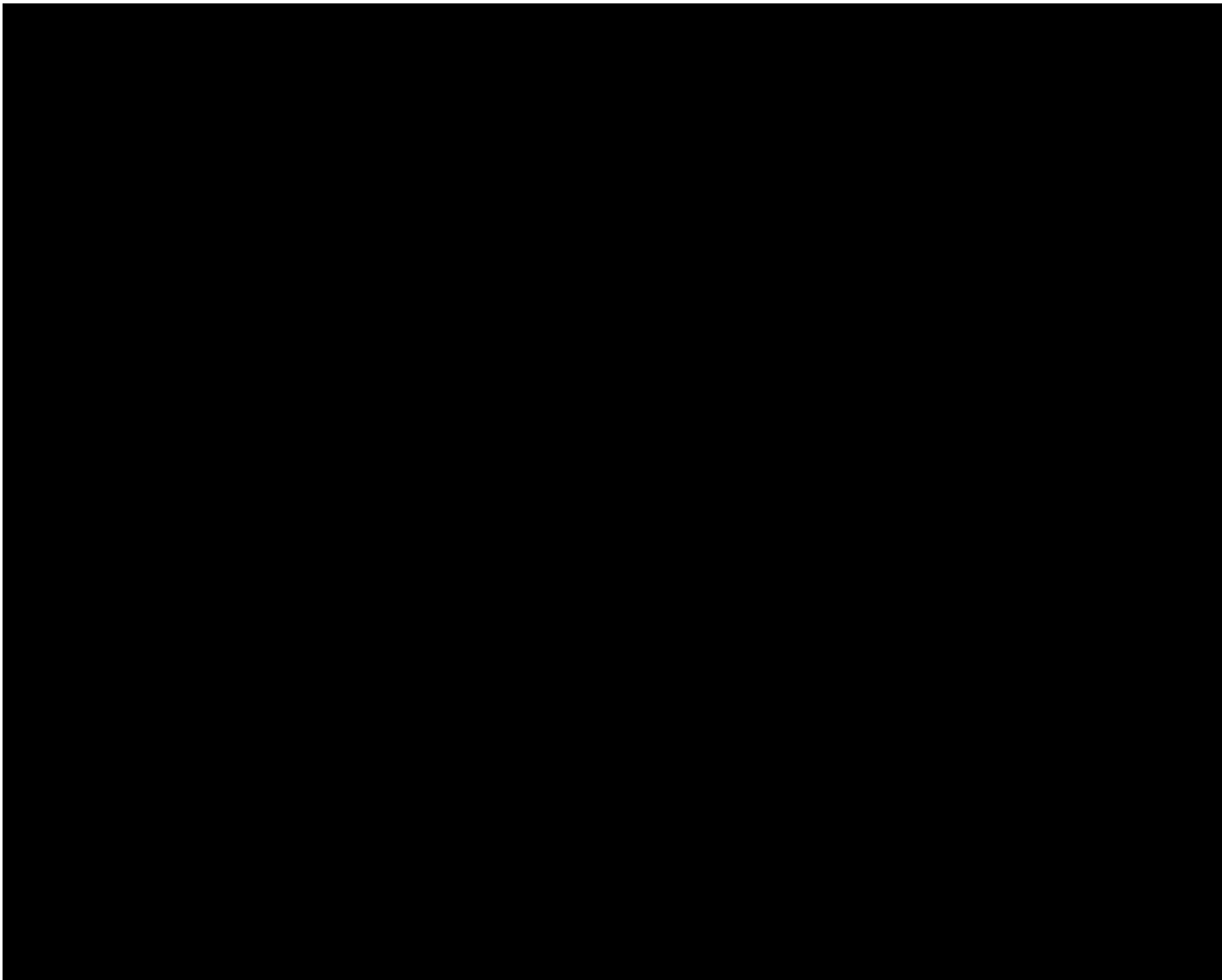

I wish to strongly object to the Local Authorities Draft Plan to build around 45 properties on part of the land between Stourbridge Road and Crimmond Rise.

My wife and I have lived at 360 Stourbridge Road for over 30 years. One of the main reasons we brought our house was due to the lovely countryside at the back of the house. It has been an oasis of calm after the increasing business and aggressive driving behaviour on the Stourbridge Road. Over the years we have witnessed an abundance of wildlife including foxes, badgers and numerous species of birds including buzzards. I believe that building so many houses on this land will all but decimate the wildlife that we, and our neighbours have been privileged to enjoy.

Another equally important point is just how much more traffic can the Stourbridge Road cope with? Since we have been at the property I have witnessed several accidents and my wife's car was written off 3 years ago due to a careless driver paying more attention to their phone rather than their driving. The road is heavily congested many times during the day already. I have been so concerned with my own and other people's safety I have attended various meetings with the Stourbridge Road WhatsApp group to try and plan a way forward with the police and our local councillors to look at the potential of possible road calming measures. I often feel I take my life in my hands whenever I try and park on my driveway and this is before any new development takes place! I therefore strongly advise you to please reconsider such planning and let us concentrate on making what we already have safer for all.
