Objection.

Policy DLP60 identifies Areas of High Historic Landscape Value and states the Council will resist any development or other works taking place which would be detrimental to the character, quality and historic integrity of the landscape. Further it states that the Council will seek to protect and enhance views into, from or within Areas of High Historic Landscape Value. Approval will not be given where such views would be unduly interrupted or harmed, or where the opportunity to enhance such a view would be lost. In conjunction with Policy DLP55, it essentially seeks to identify these areas as non-designated heritage assets. The policy is objected to. The areas of land identified in the plan are extensive and so broad as to not properly identify their significance. Further the policy affords levels of protection which are excessive, not only applying to the land identified but adjoining land and views to and from the identified AHHLV. They effectively amount to a blanket protection of all development on or anywhere near these identified areas which seems unreasonable, especially given the extent of land which they effect in the Borough.
